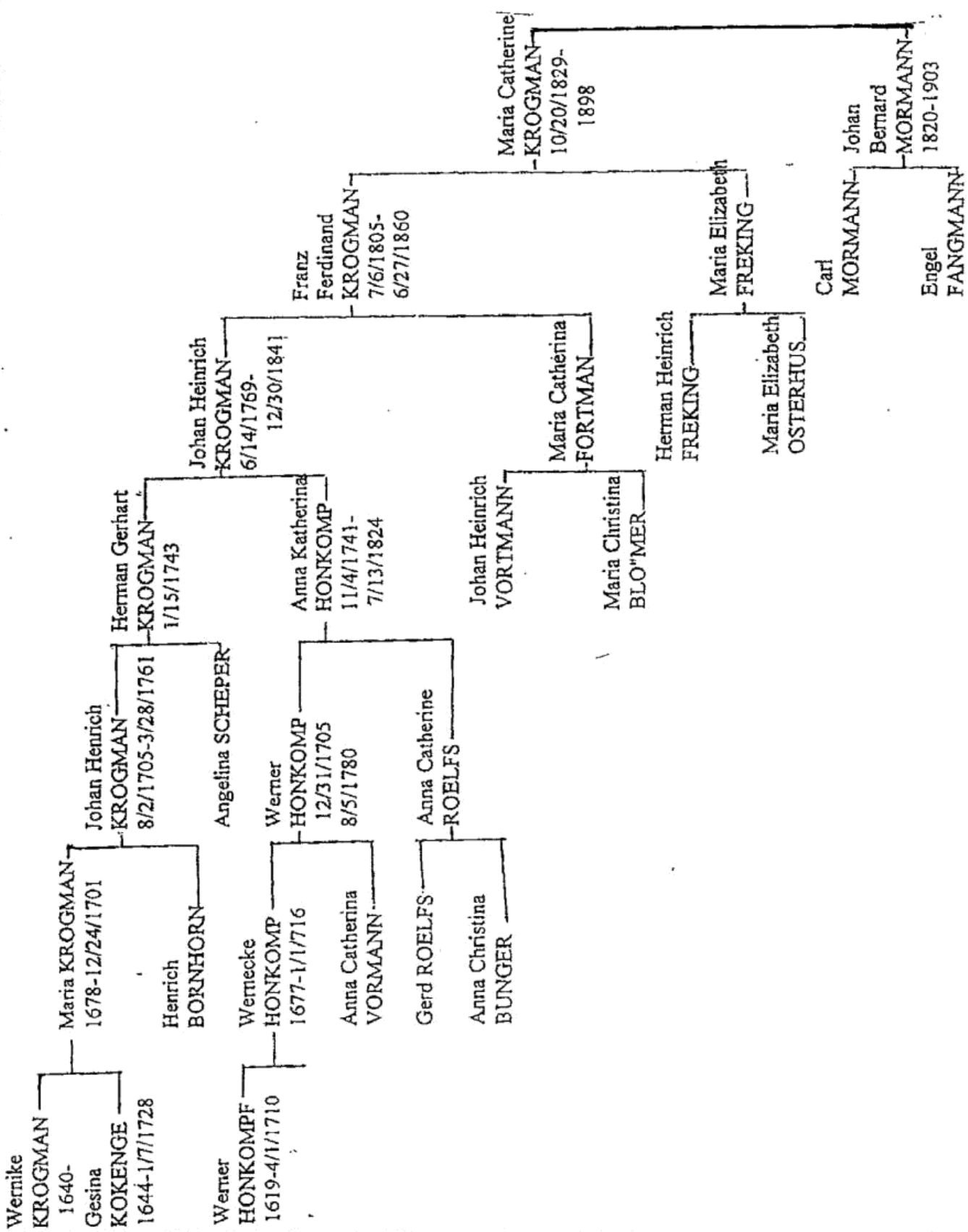

Johann Bernard and Maria Catharina Krogmann Mormann

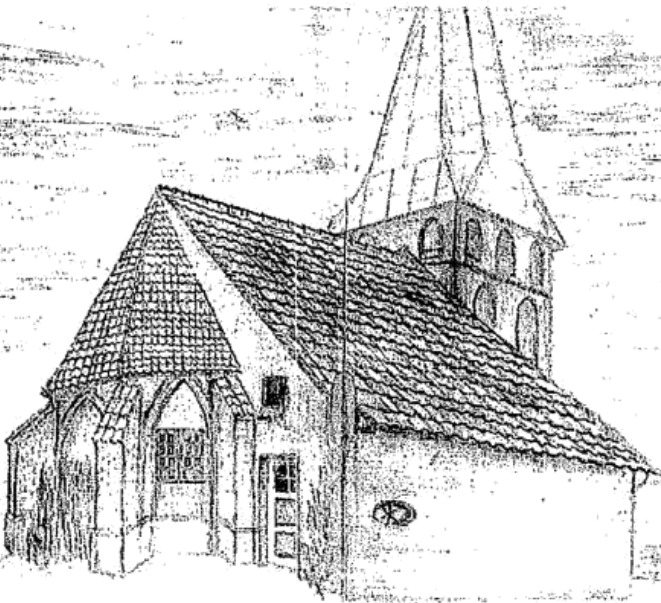
Our Mormann ancestry in this country began with Johann Bernard Mormann and Maria Catherina Krogmann. Johann was born on July 15, 1823 in Osterfeine-Damme, Oldenburg, Germany to Carl and Engel Fangmann Mormann. Catherina was born on October 20, 1829 in Holthausen, Steinfeld, Germany to Franz Ferdinand and Maria Elizabeth Freking Krogmann. Their marriage took place at St. John the Baptist Catholic Church in Steinfeld, Germany on February 3, 1853. Church records show that following their marriage they worked as a "hired-hand" couple in the village of Holdorf, just west of Steinfeld.

On June 10, 1858 Bernard and Catherine landed in the USA with their two children, John Bernard Jr. and Josephine. (It is thought that a third child, William, was born in Germany but there is no record of his birth or death.) The family went immediately to Iowa where they rented a farm near New Vienna. Their daughter, Catherine, was born here in 1859. Their next move was to Delaware County where they rented a farm for two+ years. In 1862, they purchased eighty acres in Section 9 of Delaware County. This farm was located on the east side of the Petersburg blacktop about a mile south of town. In 1863, they purchased the 40 acres across the

east/west road from the buildings and in 1866 they purchased the adjoining (eastside) forty for a total of 160 acres. They resided on this farm until their deaths---Catherine in 1898 and Bernard in 1903.

Seven children were born to Bernard and Catherine:

1. **John B. Mormann (1853-1920)** who married Elizabeth Tapke February 12, 1873 in Petersburg, Iowa. They had 10 children. Their four oldest children (sons) died in the diphtheria epidemic during the summer of 1886. John and Elizabeth farmed near Petersburg. John died in 1920 and Elizabeth in 1939 in Petersburg.
2. **Josephine (1855-1933)** who first married John Goebel on July 7, 1874 in New Vienna, Iowa. They had 10 children before John's death on February 22, 1894. Josephine then married Casper Schmieding on October 16, 1894. Casper was a widower with 6 children. Casper and Josephine had 4 children from their marriage. Casper died in 1931 and Josephine in 1933 in Madison, Minnesota.
3. **William** (possibly born in Germany; died in infancy, no record of his birth or death)
4. **Catherine (1859-1928)** married Joseph Mayrose on January 15, 1878 in Petersburg, Iowa. They farmed near Oyens in Plymouth County, Iowa. They had 11 children. Catherine died in 1928 and Joseph in 1933 on their farm near Oyens.
5. **Mary (1861-1863)** died at age 2 in Petersburg, Iowa.
6. **Frank (1864-1884)** died two days before his twentieth birthday in Petersburg, Iowa.
7. **Henry (1868-1938)** married Agnes Deppe on May 20, 1890 in Petersburg, Iowa. They had 9 children before her death on February 13, 1909. Henry then married Catherine (Kate) Roling on April 5, 1910 in Petersburg. They had 6 children. Henry was engaged in farming and the buying and shipping of livestock. Henry died in 1938 in Petersburg and Kate in 1947 in Dyersville.

THE HEURLING SYSTEM AND EMIGRATION FROM GERMANY

The heurling system had its beginning in the 16th and 17th centuries. The main factor that prompted this system was the existing right of inheritance, which made the oldest married son the sole heir to property. The younger sons were due only a "child's portion" of the inheritance, leaving many of them with a dismal future as sub-servient workers on their older brother's estate. When there were no sons the farm went to the oldest daughter, but her husband had to take her surname so the land stayed in the same family name. The German expression for this, roughly translated, was "generations of people come and go, but the farm remains". *Note in the Krogmann lineage chart on Generation 2 where the children of Maria Krogmann and Henrich Bornhorn retained the Krogmann name. This indicates that the Krogmann's, at that time, were a "landed" family.*

The religious upheaval following the *Reformation* and the *Thirty Year War* served to make substantial changes in the village social structure. Perhaps as a result of these unsettled times the younger farmers' sons often would not accept their fate without some protest. At the same time the farmers themselves were among the hardest hit populace following the war. Their lands had been devastated, their cattle stolen and their homes plundered. The demands of the government for tax revenues to be extracted from the farmers rose constantly, and with that, the indebtedness of the farmers. Faced with adversity, the possibility of the fixed income from farm lease arrangements and the discontinuance of the burdensome inheritance tax held a certain appeal. The introduction of the Heuerleute (heurling) system could alleviate the problems of both sides, the farmers as well as the departing farm sons. The farmer would make a portion of his land available for which he could expect a suitable fee, with a number of hands available to assist in his operations.

The heuerlette would receive a piece of land from the farmer providing grazing rights on the "common land" and living quarters. These living quarters, which were furnished and maintained by the farmer, were in the beginning and for a long time after, exceedingly primitive. One would select an out building...such as barns, stables or a baking hut, and make minimal changes to convert it for human habitation. Even the later heuer houses, usually constructed to house two families, were invariably narrow and offered few amenities. As modest as the shelters were for the heuerleute, their living conditions were similarly wanting. On the tiny strip of arable land, allotted to him, grain was planted. The soil in Holdorf in the best years was barely adequate to feed a 4-member family. A yield beyond that (to offer for sale) was at best a wish. Planting potatoes came into play in the 18th century and gained rapid acceptance thereafter. Vegetables grown in one's own garden could enrich a family's menu. A meat diet among the heuerleute was a rare event.

Even among those of the Heuerlette who understood how to augment their income through some other form of activity, their basic income remained whatever their strip of land would bring forth. This included one or two cows, which were the most prized possessions of the heuermann. Until the common grounds were subdivided, the cows would graze on the communal meadow. Since the Heuerlette were ignored when it came to subdividing land, they would have to settle for strips of grass along ditches and roads, where their children would attend to the animals.

Because of the greatly limited acreage allotted the Heuermann, he treated it with great respect and care. He became more meticulous than the farmer about keeping weeds under control and harvesting the limited produce. The farmers, in their farming duties, abused the Heuerleute to an extraordinary degree. Whenever the farmer summoned the Heuermann the latter would be obligated to drop the task at hand and report for duty. These summonses would occur most frequently during times of high labor intensity, such as hay and grain harvesting, flax "drawing" and manure spreading. This made it necessary for the Heuermann to defer his own operations to the late evening and early morning hours. As a result his produce was likely to be moist or immature. The extent of the Heuermann's specific duties was not committed to paper and was subject to the whims of the farmer. Much of the heuerlette's condition depended on the goodwill of the farmer. In some cases the farmer would come to the aid of the Heuermann at harvest time, making available to him beasts of burden and wagons, as needed. In many cases relationships covered several generations and mutual consideration would govern.

From a small beginning the Heuerling system expanded more and more, and particularly in the 18th century, developed a spectacular growth dynamic. From a listing prepared in the year 1835 for the Holdorf Parish it is learned that 98 farmers were shown opposite 287 Heuerleute families. The growth of the Holdorf community is attributable to the rise in the number of the Heuerleute. In 1649, Holdorf counted 470 inhabitants; 180 years later (1828) this number nearly quintupled. The Heuerling system enabled these many people to provide for their own livelihood, yet the economic basis continued to shrink with this population growth. For this reason it was beneficial in the 17th and 18th centuries when new possibilities for augmentation of their income arose. The first such activity was the weaving of linen fabric, which could engage all family members. The second important source of side income was the trek to Holland, to work in the farm fields or to cut peat moss. The farmers were able to profit from these increased funds flowing into the community. The average farmer enlarged the number of Heuerlings from one at the beginning to five - seven. Early in the 19th century the Heuerling system experienced a temporary crisis, due to the disappearance of the side income; the heuerleute suffered greatly with the drying up of this source of income. The situation became rather hopeless for the Heuerleute and was an important factor in prompting them to look toward emigration to America.

Beginning in the 1830's in the South of Oldenburg there took place a wave of emigration, the extent of which defies description in today's terms. At the end of the 19th century there were more farmers from Holdorf in America than there were in Holdorf. The large stream of emigrants was made up of a very broad spectrum of individuals. It is said that each family from the Holdorf, Damme, and Oldenburg areas had at least one member that emigrated. The emigration left deep scars within individual families, in circles of friends and in the village community as a whole.

What were the reasons for such a huge emigrant population from this part of Germany? First, was the dire straits of the Heuerleute whose relations had become strained with the farmer for whom he worked. Second, was the reduction in the number of persons who made the seasonal trips to Holland for employment purposes. The third reason was the fact that nearly all of the local inhabitants already had family members and friends in America, who made constant efforts to encourage left-behind family members to follow them to the New World.

Entire families took courage to embark on the voyage across the Atlantic, often including aged parents and infant children. People from a given area in Germany often reassembled at a given destination in America. Usually this destination was wider than a single village (rarely larger than a county) where they continued their old social ties. This meant that they did not enter a strange nor hostile environment and were certainly not rootless. The old sense of community prevailed. The importance of this should not be underestimated as starting a new life was demanding and by itself presented an enormous burden. Living quarters had to be erected, land had to be made arable and prepared for cultivation; tools were scarce, implements more so. The most obvious presence of this sense of community is the numerous marriages within a particular group of immigrants, especially in the first generation. The influence of the Church in the personal lives of the new immigrants was not any less than it had been in the homeland. Quite soon after arrival neighbors would join together to build a House of God and engage the services of a pastor. In the rural areas particularly, the cultural and religious values of their homeland were carefully nurtured, not simply for sentimental or memorial purposes, but as solid standards in daily life.

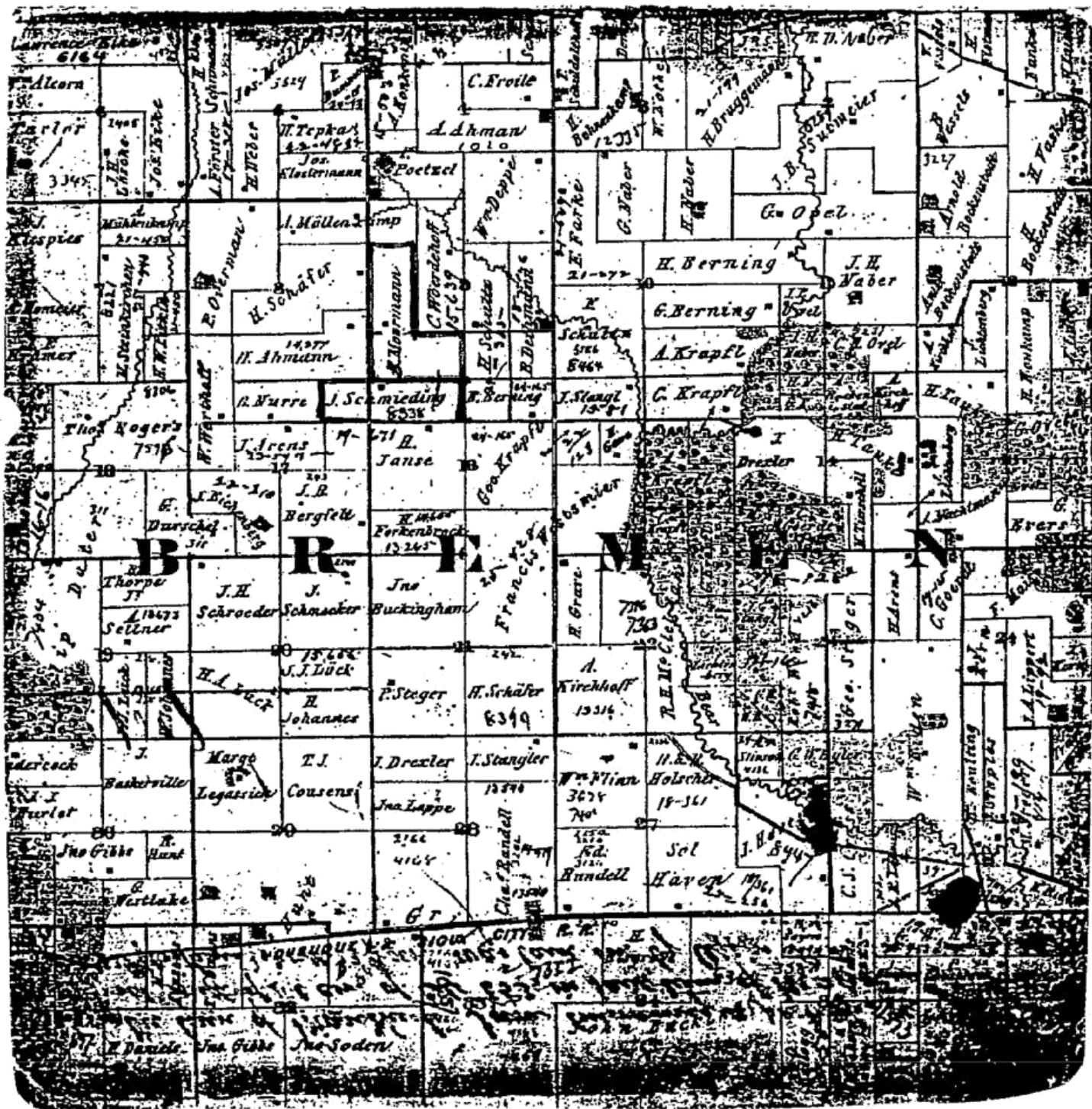

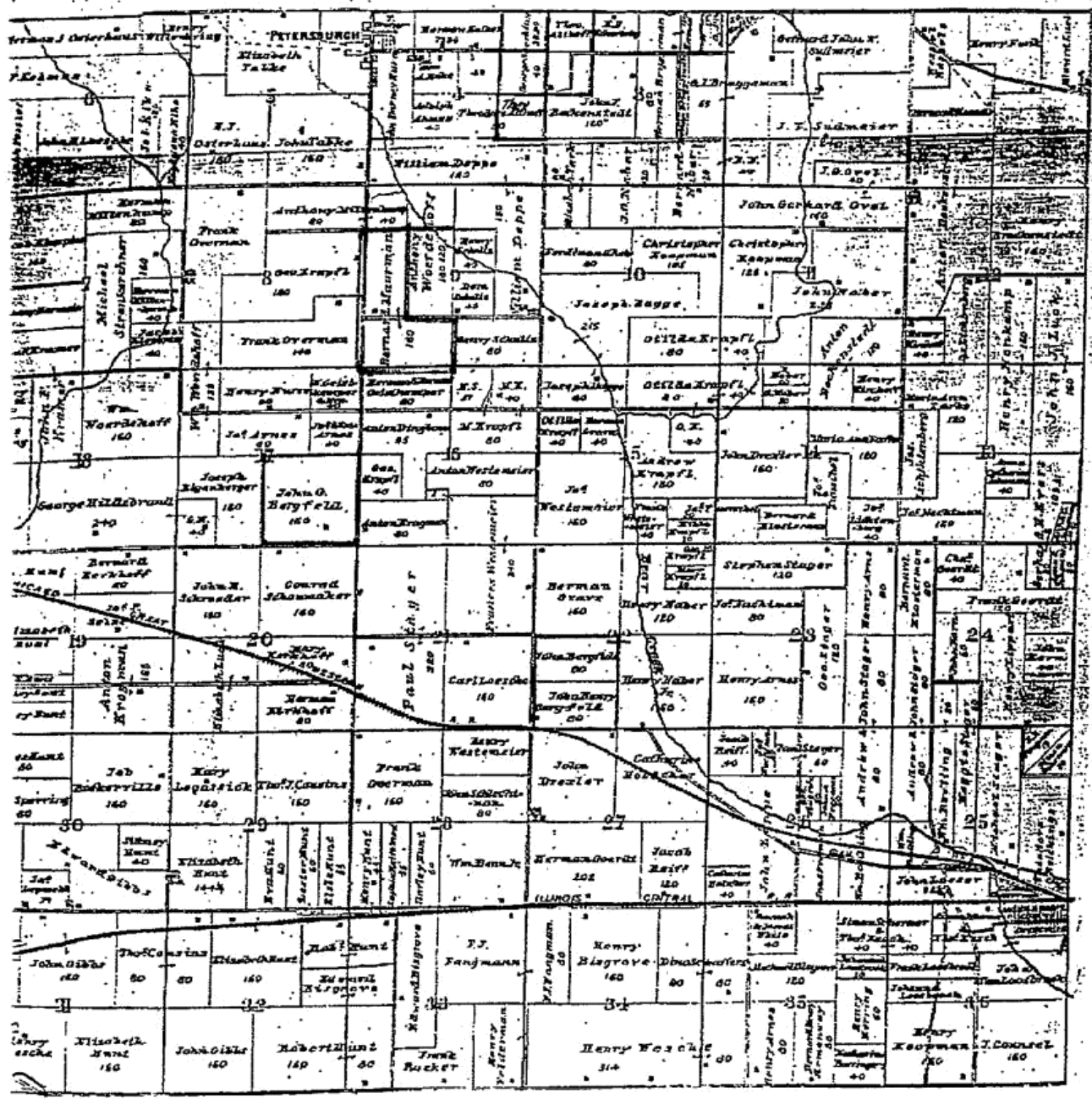
(Showing the Mormann Farm in Section 9)

J. BERNARD MORMANN SR

Mr. J. Bernard Mormann died at his home near Petersburg on August 23, 1903, after a long spell of sickness at the age of 80 years.

Deceased was a native of Oldenburg, Germany, being born at Kaspiel-Damme in 1823. He was educated at his native home and grew to manhood there and was united in marriage with Miss Katherine Krogmann.

They came to America in 1843 and settled at New Vienna and ten years later settled on their farm near Petersburg.

He is survived by four children: J. Bernard, Henry, Josephine, wife of C. Schmieding and Katie, wife of J. Mayrose.

The deceased was one of the pioneer settlers of this vicinity and enjoyed the confidence and esteem of a large circle of friends.

The funeral took place at Petersburg last Wednesday and after requiem services burial took place in the cemetery nearby, Rev. Father Sassen performing the last sad rites.

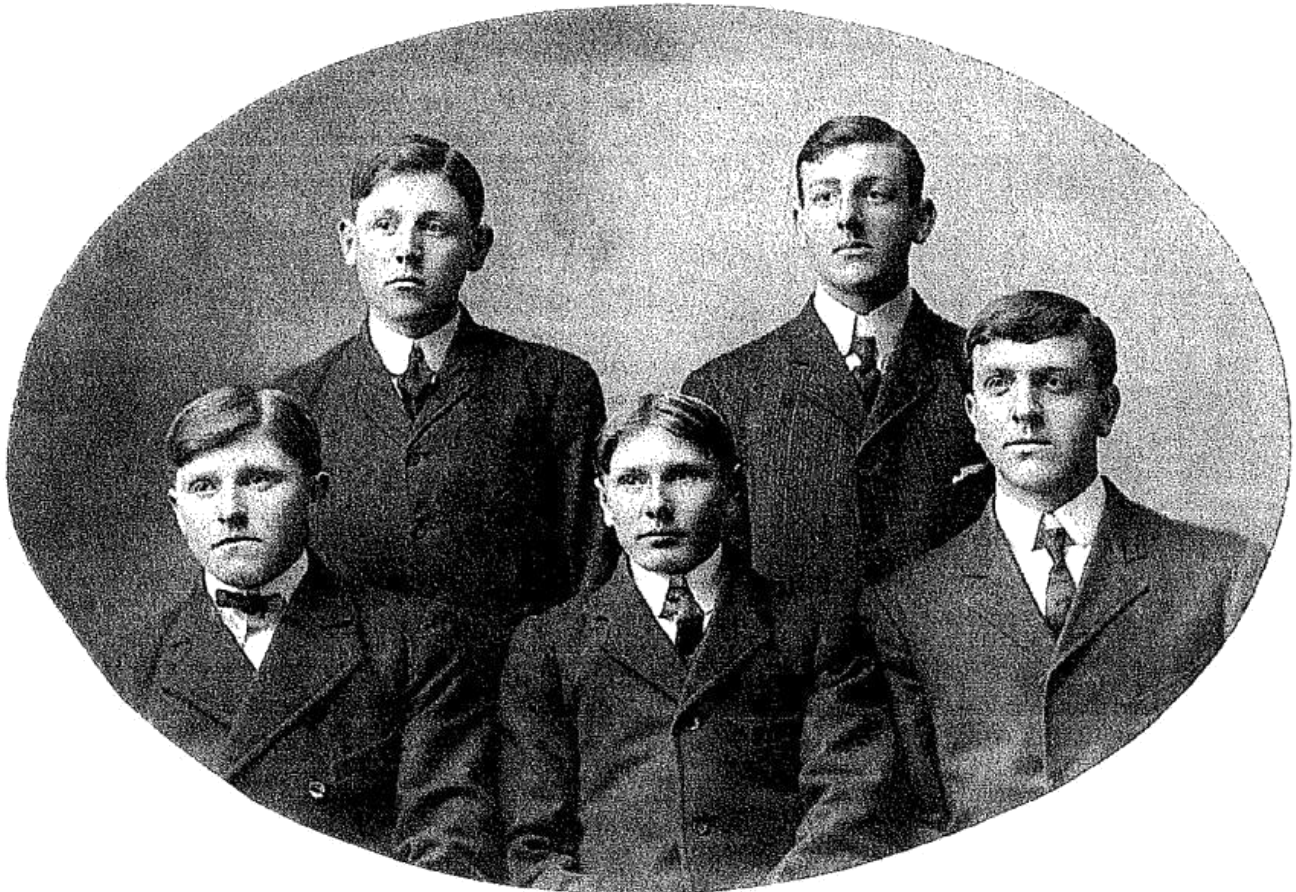

JOHN BERNARD MORMANN

Mr. John Bernard Mormann, one of the most highly esteemed residents of Petersburg passed away at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Jos. Detmer on West DeWitt Street in this city last Saturday evening at 10:30 o'clock, after an illness, of a few days. He had not been in the best of health since last February, when he fell and sustained an injury in his chest. Since that time he had been under a physician's care. Some time ago, he went to Dubuque for treatment. He returned on the afternoon train and while on his way from Dubuque he was taken suddenly seriously ill and when he arrived here he went to the home of Mr. and Mrs. Detmer, intimate friends for years, where his condition grew rapidly worse in spite of all that medical skill could do, and he passed away at time stated above, complications having developed that caused his demise.

Mr. Mormann was born at Steinfeld, Oldenburg, Germany, on October 15, 1853 and was therefore 66 years 8 mos. and 16 days old at the time of his death. At the age of five years he came to the United States with his parents, and settled in Dubuque county and resided in this community all his life. On February 12, 1873, he was united in marriage to Miss Elizabeth Tapke, in SS Peter and Paul's church at Petersburg, the Rev. Father Maasjost officiating. After their marriage they went to housekeeping on their farm near Petersburg, which has been the family home since. Ten children were born to them, four of whom died as a result of diphtheria a number of years ago. They were Henry, Frank, John and Fred. Another son, Albert, died at the age of 13, having met with an accident. Those who with the grief-stricken wife survive are: Anton, at home, Bernard J. of Adrian, Minnesota; Catherine, Joseph C. and Rose at home. He is also survived by his brother, Henry, of Petersburg, his sisters, Mrs. Casper Schmieding of

Madison, Minnesota, and Mrs. Joseph Mayrose of Oyens. Two brothers, William and Frank and one sister Mary preceded him to the grave years ago.

The funeral took place last Wednesday morning at 9:30 o'clock from the family home to SS. Peter and Paul's church where requiem mass was read for the repose of his soul by his cousin, Rev. Jos. Brinkmann of Guttenberg, assisted by Rev. Charles Goetzinger of Ionia, as deacon and Rev. Loosbrock of Petersburg as sub-deacon. Interment was made in SS. Peter and Paul cemetery. The honorary pallbearers were members of the Knights of Columbus, Messrs Louis Koelker, Anthony Kerper, Joseph Bagge, Ben Loesche, Clem Engelken and Richard Krapfl. The active pallbearers were Messrs. Henry Koelker, Herman Kruse, Frank Osterhaus, John Koopmann, Louis Willenbring and Frank Rolfes.

Among the relatives present at the funeral from abroad were Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Mayrose of Oyens, Mr. and Mrs. Caspar Schmieding of Madison, Minn., Charley Niehaus of Remsen, Henry and Barney Tapke, Henry Rolling, Luxemburg, Ben J. Morman of Glen Haven, Wis., Mr. and Mrs. Andrew Fesler, Dyersville; Mrs. Elizabeth Evers, Dyersville; Emma Mormann, New Vienna.

In the death of Mr. Mormann the community loses one of its most widely known citizens, for Mr. Mormann was known throughout this section of Iowa as a progressive and successful farmer. He was public spirited and took an active interest in all public matters for the benefit of the community. He was a kind father and husband and his death comes as a sad blow to the members of the family. To his neighbors he was courteous and considerate and he was ready to make sacrifices for others which won him a place in the hearts of his fellowmen. He was an active member of the R.C.M.P.S. and of Dyersville Council, Knights of Columbus. (Dyersville Commercial---July 1920)

ELIZABETH MORMANN

Mrs. Elizabeth Mormann, pioneer resident of this place (Petersburg), passed away at her home here Tuesday morning, August 15, 1939, at 12:00 o'clock. Death followed an illness of over three years duration, due to complications, tributary to old age. She was 83 years of age.

Deceased's maiden name was Elizabeth Tapke and she was born in Iron Mound, Ky., on July 15, 1856. She grew to young womanhood in her native state and then came to Iowa to live. She has been a resident of this vicinity for over 65 years.

On Feb. 12, 1878, the deceased was united in marriage to Mr. Ben Mormann in St. Boniface Church, New Vienna, the late Rev. Father F. W. Pape officiating. They established their home on a farm near Petersburg and she has resided here ever since. Her husband and five sons preceded her in death. Those surviving are her two daughters, Rose and Kate at home and three sons, Tony of Petersburg, Ben and Joe of Adrian, Minn. She is survived also by 8 grandchildren.


The funeral took place this Thursday morning from her late home to SS Peter and Paul church at nine o'clock where requiem high mass was sung for the repose of her soul by Rev. Father Gibbs,

after which her remains were laid to rest in the family lot in SS. Peter and Paul cemetery, beside those of her husband.

Mrs. Mormann was a devout Catholic and a true Christian mother. Her thoughts were centered around her home and she performed many acts of kindness during her span of years lived. Heartfelt sympathy is extended to those left to mourn her loss.

HENRY, JOHN, FRANK, AND FRED MORMANN

Henry, John, Frank and Fred Mormann were the four oldest children of John Bernard and Elizabeth (Tapke) Mormann. These four boys died within a month's time during the diphtheria epidemic of 1886. Henry was 7 years of age, John was 5, Frank was 3 and Fred was about 18 mos. of age. They share a common gravestone in the SS. Peter and Paul Catholic Cemetery in Petersburg, Iowa.

ALBERT MORMANN

Albert Mormann, thirteen-year-old son of J. Bernard and Elizabeth Mormann, met a tragic death at Petersburg Friday evening (May 10, 1906), the result of an accidental discharge of a rifle. The accident occurred in the field where an older brother, who was plowing, had taken the gun that afternoon to shoot ground squirrels. Albert had returned from Petersburg where he attended school and with a younger brother went to the field after supper about seven o'clock. They found the rifle where the older boy who was some distance in the field, had left it. Thinking it was not loaded the boys took up the weapon, when it was in some manner discharged with results as stated above. The bullet entered below the left eye, taking an upward course, penetrated the brain. He was taken to his home and a physician summoned. The boy died within two hours after the accident without regaining consciousness. The shocking death of the youth cast a gloom of sorrow over the entire community. The boy was a regular attendant at the parochial school and was to receive his first holy communion with the class at Petersburg this spring. He was born in that community and was a member of a well-known family. (Obituary from Dyersville Commercial---May 1906)

ANTON AND ROSE WILLENBRING MORMANN

Anton was the fifth child of J. Bernard and Elizabeth Mormann. On September 11, 1923 he was married to Rose Marie Willenbring, daughter of Louis and Anna Meyer Willenbring, in Petersburg, Iowa. Rose was born on November 6, 1900 in Petersburg. Anton spent his entire lifetime farming until his retirement in Petersburg. Anton and Rose had no children. Anton died July 22, 1974 in Dyersville. Rose passed away on October 11, 1974 in Dyersville. They are buried in SS. Peter and Paul Cemetery in Petersburg.

CATHERINE (KATE) MORMANN

Kate Mormann was born July 19, 1891 in Petersburg, Iowa, the seventh child and first daughter of J. Bernard and Elizabeth Mormann. Kate lived all her life in the Petersburg area. She did not marry. Her death came on September 1, 1979 in Dyersville, Iowa. She is buried in SS. Peter and Paul Cemetery, Petersburg.

ROSE MORMANN

Rose Mormann was the youngest child of J. Bernard and Elizabeth Mormann. She was born on March 24, 1898 in Petersburg, Iowa. Rose, also, did not marry.
