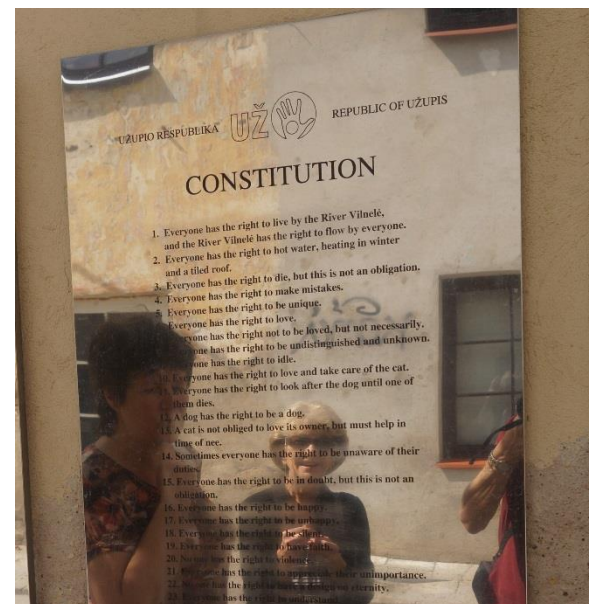
St. Anne's Catholic Church and Monastery

Everyone has the right to live by the River Vilacle and the River has the right to flow by everyone. 2. Everyone has the right to hot water, heating in the winter and a tiled roof. 3. Everyone has the right to die but it is not an obligation.
